Profile: Pima Air & Space Museum, operated by the not-for-profit Arizona Aerospace Foundation (AAF), is the largest privately funded aviation and aerospace museum in the world and the third largest aviation museum in the U.S. Established on May 8, 1976, the museum displays more than 300 of the most significant aircraft in the history of flight. Admission includes the 390th Memorial Museum, an independent military museum, and the Arizona Aviation Hall of Fame, another AAF operation, located on the grounds. In addition, the museum features more than 125,000 artifacts including a moon rock and numerous exhibits in five hangars on over 80 acres. The museum operates the exclusive tour of the U.S. government's and military's only "Boneyard" aka AMARG (309th Aerospace Regeneration and Maintenance Group) on the adjacent Davis-Monthan Air Force Base showcasing 4,000+ planes on 2,600 acres (additional fee).
